Last week, our theme was "expectations" - what do we look for in Christ. But, as we well know, expectations that are not met give rise to disappointment leaving us down in the dumps and depressed. One's confidence is put to the test and one's faith wavers. Today's liturgy sets itself to reassure us; it shouts aloud "Rejoice! do not be afraid" The challenges of life are not beyond those who call on God's help.

Zepaniah 3:14-18 With the exception of this passage, the whole of Zephaniah's prophecy is unmitigated doom and gloom; but here he encourages the Israelites not to give up their hope in God's power to save, and he tells them to rejoice in this hope.

Philippians 4: 4-7 emphasises that the challenge of being Christ's disciples should be met with joy! Face up to what you are and let people know why you are what you are!

Luke 3: 10-18 tells of John preparing his disciples for the coming of the Messiah. He wants them to be more generous, honest and fair in their dealings with people. His advice is directed to a broad cross section of the community including taxpayers and soldiers.

The Season of Advent



As the days get shorter in many parts of the world, we enter a season of waiting and preparation. Both Lent and Advent are seasons of waiting, preparation, and penance. Like Lent, Advent is a season of waiting, preparation and repentance. The colour purple liturgically represents these spiritual themes for both seasons. During Lent, we await Christ's return from 40 days in the desert, His loving sacrifice for us, and Resurrection. In Advent, we prepare for His birth. The birth and resurrection of Christ are intertwined, and their connection is quite significant theologically. Yet, these seasons of waiting look different for us – Advent is a uniquely joyous and hopeful season in the Church.

We light candles amidst the darkness. We find warmth in the cold, dark winter season. And we come together as friends and family to celebrate the coming of our Saviour.

Advent is also the beginning of a new liturgical year. (This Advent season marks the start of Year C.) We begin the year anew, renewed by His birth.

The Advent wreath is a common symbol of the liturgical season. Its purpose is *literally* to light the way to the true Light of the World. The circular wreath, typically made of evergreen leaves like pine or fir, represents God's infinite and everlasting love for us. It also holds four candles to light each Sunday of Advent.

Prayer for Lighting the First Candle - Hope: "Loving God, as we light the first Advent candle of hope, we ask for your presence to fill our hearts and homes. May the hope of Christ's coming bring light to our darkness and renew our spirits. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

"God of peace, as we light the second Advent candle of peace, may your peace fill our hearts and our world. Help us to be peacemakers in our relationships and communities. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

Prayer for Lighting the Third Candle - Joy: "Gracious God, as we light the third Advent candle of joy, may the joy of your salvation fill us with gladness. Help us to share this joy with others, especially those in need. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

Prayer for Lighting the Fourth Candle - Love: "Heavenly Father, as we light the fourth Advent candle of love, may your love inspire us to love one another as you have loved us. Let your love guide our actions and words. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."
