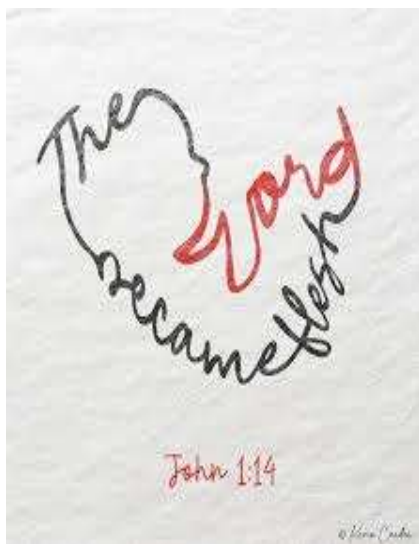

First reading: Sirach 24:1-2, 8-12 The First Reading speaks of praise of Wisdom. The Hebrew concept of Wisdom portrays a Wisdom as a female person who is to be honoured and praised. There is a close link between the Old Testament understanding of Wisdom and GOD.

Psalm: Psalm 147: 12-13, 14-15, 19-20 The Psalm also speaks of the Word of GOD and shows the power of the Word of GOD in touching the lives of faithful believers.

Second reading: Ephesians 1: 3-6, 15-18 In the selection from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, Paul also speaks of the link of Jesus and the Spirit of Wisdom which give knowledge of who Jesus is.

Gospel: John 1:1-18 This reading might sound tricky, but it isn't really. There was lots of talk about the Word. From the very beginning of time the Word was with God and the Word was God. And the Word brought life and light to the world. The Word is another name for Jesus. So, throughout this gospel reading it is talking about Jesus, who is the Son of God. The gospel reminds us that God sent his only Son, Jesus, into the world to be with us.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD – HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION

What is the significance of Epiphany in Christian Tradition?

This holy day marks the arrival of the Magi to worship the Baby Jesus and the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as the Savior of the world. However, longstanding tradition connects the Epiphany with two additional events: the baptism of the Lord and the miraculous transformation of water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee.

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF CHALK

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk at the Masses for Epiphany and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. The home blessing can be done as follows:

Use the blessed chalk to write: **CMB+2026** above the doorways: **2026** for the year; **CMB** for the three Magi – Casper, Melchior and Balthasar – and for **Christus Mansionem Benedicat** – Latin for “May Christ bless this house.”
