Forgiveness How seriously do I take the need to be reconciled? Do I allow grudges to drag on? Do I see a need to forgive and be forgiven? Today's readings give definite answers to these situations as they affect those who accept the leadership of Christ.

Ecclesiasticus 27:30, 28:7 - Here we see the groundwork being laid for Christ's specific instruction to forgive if we expect to be forgiven.

Romans 14: 7-9: - As is so often the case with St. Paul, he uses theology to develop a philosophical argument to state that individual attitudes affect the lives of those around us.

Matthew 18:21-35: - Here Matthew takes a parable employed by Christ and uses it to provide guidelines for communal living in the early Christian communities. He draws their attention to the need to forgive each other repeatedly.

The apparition of Our Lady of La Salette

On September 19, 1846, **Our Lady** appeared to two small children on the mountain of La Salette in the French Alps. The apparition of **Our Lady of La Salette** is known for its emphasis on repentance, reverence for the Sunday and the consequences of spiritual neglect. The message specifically condemned working on Sundays ("they labour all day Sunday") and neglecting Mass. A direct warning was issued against swearing and using the holy name of Christ irreverently ("Those who drive the carts cannot swear without using my Son's name"). The warning tied spiritual disobedience to physical hardships, such as the failure of crops and impending famine. On the contrary, spiritual conversion promised abundance ("rocks and stones will turn into heaps of wheat").

Following a five-year investigation, the apparition was officially approved, declaring it as having the characteristics of truth and worthy of the faithful's belief. Consequently in 1852 the Congregation of Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette was founded to serve as a "perpetual remembrance of Mary's merciful Apparition."

The Story of the Apparition of Our Lady of La Salette

On September 19, 1846, Our Lady appeared to two small children on the mountain of La Salette in the French Alps. There, she gave them a message for the world to hear and follow. Mary's message to the two children at La Salette was the warning of a mother concerned over her wayward children.

She complained: "If my people refuse to submit, I will be forced to let go the arm of my Son" and more specifically: "Those who drive the carts cannot swear without using my Son's name...they labour all day Sunday...there are none who go to Mass... when they do not know what to do, they go to Mass just to make fun of religion..." She warned: "If the harvest is ruined, it is only on account of yourselves...If you have wheat, you must not sow it. Anything you sow the vermin will eat...A great famine is coming..." She promised: "If [my people] are converted, rocks and stones will turn into heaps of wheat, and potatoes will be self-sown in the fields..." She pleaded: "Well, my children, make this known to all my people..." Through the children she gave her message of "Reconciliation" to the world. She insisted that this message be made known to all her people.

On September 19, 1851, after "a precise and rigorous investigation" of the event, the witnesses, the content of the message, and its repercussions, Philibert de Bruillard, Bishop of Grenoble, pronounced his judgment in a pastoral letter of instruction. He declared that "the apparition of the Blessed Virgin to two shepherds, ... *bears within itself all the characteristics of truth and the faithful have grounds for believing it to be indubitable and certain.*"

The apparition and message inspired the Catholic Religious Community, the Missionaries of La Salette, whose ministry is based on reconciliation. The La Salette Missionaries have a congregation of about 1,000 priests and brothers, and 200 LaSalette Sisters, serving in more than 20 countries.
