Isaiah 55: 6-9: The Prophet makes this point when he wrote "my thoughts are not your thoughts; my ways are not your ways - it is the Lord who speaks". Down through the centuries, various attempts have been made to present God as an avenging judge ready to pounce on the slightest offense. There can be no doubting divine justice; however, that only comes into play when there has been no effort on our part to respond to the proven generosity of God's love.

Phil: 1:20-24,27: St. Paul is well aware of this. At the time of writing the passage read this morning, he was in prison awaiting judgement; but he is quite at ease. Whatever happens he is reconciled; despite his failures, and aware of God's generosity, he has no fear of dying because he has made some effort to serve God. Death would be a fulfilment; if, on the other hand, he is freed, he will continue to work for the Lord.

Matthew 20: 1-16: But it is the gospel that hammers home this message of God's generosity. By our standards, His behaviour is not on. I mean - what about 'equal pay for equal work'? Or could this be an early example of workplace agreement? Whatever! The point is that God will never be outstripped in generosity. Good will in any measure will not go unrewarded.

The Story of the Apparition of Our Lady of La Salette

On September 19, 1846, Our Lady appeared to two small children on the mountain of La Salette in the French Alps. There, she gave them a message for the world to hear and follow. Mary's message to the two children at La Salette was the warning of a mother concerned over her wayward children.

She complained: "If my people refuse to submit, I will be forced to let go the arm of my Son" and more specifically: "Those who drive the carts cannot swear without using my Son's name...they labour all day Sunday...there are none who go to Mass... when they do not know what to do, they go to Mass just to make fun of religion..." She warned: "If the harvest is ruined, it is only on account of yourselves...If you have wheat, you must not sow it. Anything you sow the vermin will eat...A great famine is coming..." She promised: "If [my people] are converted, rocks and stones will turn into heaps of wheat, and potatoes will be self-sown in the fields..." She pleaded: "Well, my children, make this known to all my people..." Through the children she gave her message of "Reconciliation" to the world. She insisted that this message be made known to all her people.

On September 19, 1851, after "a precise and rigorous investigation" of the event, the witnesses, the content of the message, and its repercussions, Philibert de Bruillard, Bishop of Grenoble, pronounced his judgment in a pastoral letter of instruction. He declared that "the apparition of the Blessed Virgin to two shepherds, ... *bears within itself all the characteristics of truth and the faithful have grounds for believing it to be indubitable and certain.*"



Consequently in 1852 the Congregation of Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette was founded to serve as a "perpetual remembrance of Mary's merciful Apparition."

The apparition and message inspired the Catholic Religious Community, the Missionaries of La Salette, whose ministry is based on reconciliation. The La Salette Missionaries have a congregation of about 1,000 priests and brothers, and 200 LaSalette Sisters, serving in more than 20 countries.
